“If any man thirst, let him come unto me, and drink”, (John 7:37)

The Gospel is for everyone. It does not matter what country or creed.

“Whosoever” - (John 3:16, etc); “God is no respecter of persons” (Acts 10:34)

God does not have favourites. He has loved the world of sinners, not as a mass but as individuals.

There are things in the Bible that we do not understand, but the Bible is true.

The invitation is not to come to the Gospel Hall, it is “Come unto Me”. Salvation is in a person.

There is a great need that needs to be dealt with, a need we all have - Sin. The last thing men and women want to do is to confess to being a sinner. Until you recognise your need you will not desire to seek salvation.

Why is there a Saviour?

There is a Saviour because “the soul that sinneth it shall die” (Ezekiel 18:20)

From birth, we are “dead in trespasses and sins” (Ephesians 2:1) and “The wages of sin is death” (Romans 6:23). Everyone is a sinner (Rom 3:23). We were born sinners (Psalm 51:5).

“By one man sin entered the world and death by sin” (Romans 5:12). When Adam sinned the source of humanity was polluted by sin. “Can a leopard change its spots?” (Jeremiah 13:23) No, it is in its nature. We are sinners and are condemned because of our sin. Generation after generation have died because of sin.

There is satisfaction in the Gospel. Men will try anything but Christ to find satisfaction. This only quenches thirst for a short time. In John 4, the woman at the well had tried everything naturally to satisfy but to no avail. In Acts 8, the Ethiopian found religion but did not satisfy. He got saved in the desert on his way home. The important thing in his life was salvation.

“All we like sheep have gone astray” (Isaiah 53:6).

Naaman was a brave man used by God in the deliverance of His people but he was a leper. He did not have Salvation but he got it. How did he get it?

He believed the word of God and believed what God told Him.

“Neither is there Salvation in any other”

Have you got Salvation?

Have you had a time in your life where you were a sinner in need of a Saviour. You will only find Salvation in Christ.

“Let him come” - demands a response.

God is kind: “He that hears my word and believes Him that sent me has everlasting life..and shall not come into judgment”

Do you know the Gospel but have never received Him?

Woman with the issue of blood wanted to touch the hem of His garment to be healed but she had to go to Him to be saved (Mark 5:25-34).

There are people who will try and stop you getting to Christ. Bartimaeus was crying out to the Lord - "have mercy on me" but the crowd tried to stop him by saying why would the Lord want anything to do with you?

"It is time to seek the Lord" (Hosea 10:12).

"Seek and you shall find, knock and it shall be opened" (Matthew 7:7). He satisfies the longings of the heart. Nobody who comes to the Lord Jesus Christ has been unsatisfied.

There was no other good enough to pay the price of sin. If sin is to be dealt with it had to be the Lord Jesus Christ. He became a man in order that He might die for sin, "Just for the unjust" (1 Peter 3:18)

He knew no sin (2 Corinthians 5:21) and there was no sin in Him (1 John 3:5). God made Him sin and gave Him the punishment. God is a just God.

The account is settled as soon as you trust in the Lord Jesus Christ. Debt of sin paid, God is satisfied in the person of His Son. It had to be the Son of God. The law demanded, "eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth". Because He is the eternal son of God he can meet the needs of all sinners. We can be justified in death of Christ.

What are you going to do about it?

Christ divides this meeting and will divide eternity.

One door and only one and yet the sides are two. I'm on the inside, which side are you?

The door is Christ - "I am the door" (John 10:9)

You do not need to do anything as it has all been done. Come to Him and receive Him. If you are in Christ we will see you in heaven.
